Leading Australian Universities participate in

Higher Education Fairs in Kenya

Nairobi, 3rd March 2015

Media are invited to the opening ceremony of the Australian Higher Education Fairs to be held at Oshwal

Academy, Senior High Campus, Wambugu Lane off Parklands Road (opposite School of Law, University of

Nairobi), on Thursday 5th March at 9am. Australia's High Commissioner-designate to Kenya, Mr John

Feakes, will be the guest speaker. Representatives from Australian higher education institutions and the

Kenyan education system will be available for interviews.

Background

Australia has eight of the top 100 universities in the world! With over 22,000 courses across 1,100

institutions, Australia has strong academic credentials, and the education institutions are just as highly rated

as the cities that house them around the country. Australia has five of the 30 best cities in the world for

students based on student mix, affordability, quality of life, and employer activity – all important elements

for students when choosing the best study destination.

The fairs are "an opportunity for potential students and their parents, or sponsors to interact with the

Australian representatives who will give them insight about the institutions they wish to join, the

programmes they are interested in pursuing and the benefits of studying in Australia", according to organiser

Mahul Shah of Australian Education Consultants. Information on admission processes, visa counselling,

accommodation and travel advice will all be available.

College, Curtin University, the University of Western Australia, Technical & Further Education Western

University, the International College of Hotel Management, Deakin University, Australian Catholic University, Newcastle International College, Macquarie University, Griffith University and Bond University.
